The Chamber gave a warm welcome to Elaine Farrimond and Philip Smith to the meeting. Elaine and Philip run the Cornish Pasty shop at the bottom of Helm Road/Crag Brow.

It was agreed by those present at the last Chamber meeting, that the Chamber would provide a perpetual trophy to be presented to the winner of the 'junior' sailing race. The trophy would be similar to the one presented by the Chamber for the 'Windermere In Bloom' competition.

The question of adequate street lighting along Rayrigg Road from the John Peel pub to Rayrigg Road Car Park was raised. Councillor Gareth Bowness stated that this had been brought to the attention of the Town Council who were looking into the matter.

The Chamber has been asked to respond to the documents regarding World Heritage Site Inscription. Lord Clark of Windermere has indicated that there needs to be a firm decision made at a meeting on the 27<sup>th</sup> January 2006.

## Windermere Event Steering Group

The Chamber have been invited to sit on the above and at a recently attended meeting where represented by Barry Butler and Adrian Faulkner.

At the meeting it was reported that a total of £51k had been applied for in the way of grant funding. So far £15k had been award through Rural Regeneration Cumbria. Grant applications to 'Awards For All' and 'Northern Rock Building Society' are still pending.

The theme of the weekend would be a "*celebration of the Lake, present and future*" and would centred on the Lake in the Bowness area, but also having an impact the full length and breadth of the lake.

The roll of the steering group is "*to assume overall responsibility for the organising of the event.*" It was agreed that as and when necessary other people, groups and organisations would be invited to form sub-committees to oversee various smaller projects within the main project.

The Chamber reported that at its last meeting it was agreed to donate a 'perpetual' trophy for the juvenile sailing class, similar

to the one presented at the Windermere In Bloom competition. The Chamber also reported that it would try and seek the support of the businesses in the area to 'theme' their shop windows and also to dress in an appropriate manor.

It is hoped that *Manchester International Arts* would be able to produce a water based finale for the event.

It was noted that publicity would be paramount and would have to be circulated in the very near future. Initial publicity leaflets would be sent to coach operators, included in CTBs' publications and their website and sent to all businesses within the area. As it got nearer to the event more intense media awareness would be sought.

- Arts,
- Heritage
- Recreation, and
- Environment.
